Lesson I: The United Kingdom

The United Kingdom (UK) is made up of four countries:

- England,
- Wales,
- Scotland
- Northern Ireland.





The United Kingdom is part of the continent Europe.

The flag of the United
Kingdom is called the Union
Flag and is red, white and
blue. When flown at sea, the
flag is known as the Union
Flag. (Union Jack when on a
ship.)

The UK has a monarchy and a democratic government. The king is King Charles III and first in line to the throne is his eldest son, Prince William.



Lesson 2: England

England is the largest of the four countries of the United Kingdom (UK).

The capital city is London. Famous landmarks in London include Big Ben, Buckingham Palace and Tower Bridge, which crosses the River Thames.

Halesowen is a large town in England. The nearest city to Halesowen is Birmingham.
