

The United Kingdom (UK) is made up of four countries:

- England,
- Wales,
- Scotland
- Northern Ireland.

The United Kingdom is part of the continent Europe.

The UK has a monarchy and a democratic government. The queen is Queen Elizabeth II and first in line to the throne is her eldest son, Prince Charles.









The flag of the United Kingdom is called the Union Flaq and is red, white and blue. When flown at sea, the flag is known as the Union Jack.

# **England**

#### Human Features

People from England are known as English.

The official language is English.

Its clag is the St George's cross which is named after its patron saint, St George.

England is the largest of the four countries of the United Kingdom (UK). It has a population of around 55.5 million people.

## Scotland

#### Human Features

It has a population of 5.5 million people.

People from Scotland are known as Scotlish.

The national flag is the Saltire or St Andrew's Cross, named after its patron saint, St Andrew.

The official language is English but with its own distinct dialect or accent.

Longest River — Tay Largest Lake — Loch Lomond Highest Mountain — Ben Nevis





The capital city is Edinburgh.

# Wales

#### Human Features

People from Wales are known as Welsh.

It has a population of 3 million people.

The national flag is the Red Dragon and the Patron Saint is St David.

The main language is English, some people also speak or understand the Welsh language.

### Physical Features

Seas - Irish Sea, Cellic Sea

Longest River — River Tywi Largest Lake — Llyn Tegid Highest Mountain — Snowdon

The official national flag is the Union Flag of the UK and its patron saint is St Patrick..

The official language is English but some people also speak and/or understand the Gaelic language.

Longest River — River Foyle Largest Lake -Loch Neathach Highest Mountain — Slieve Donard
