 - 3. A Samaritan stops to help.
- The parable of 'The Good Samaritan' was Jesus' way of teaching people to be kind to others, even if they are different from you.
- There is only one God and God created the universe.
- Jesus' words, "treat others as you would want to be treated" is a widely known 'Golden Rule' taught by other religions too such as Islam and Hinduism.
