Key knowledge for this unit

- ★ Muslims often refer to Muhammad as 'the Prophet of God'
- ★ Muslims believe that what was revealed to Muhammad was God's message - calling him the messenger of God
- ★ Muslims believe that the message God revealed to Muhammad was the same message revealed to Prophets of God that lived before Muhammad such as Abraham, Moses and Jesus.
- ★ Muslims believe that Muhammad was a human being and was not God, nor was he half God or half human nor was he an angel. This is different compared to Christian beliefs about Jesus.
- ★ Muhammad was born about 550 years after Jesus had died.

Vocabulary you will use:

Word	Definition
messengers of God	A person who has been given revelations from God to pass on to others
Jesus	Believed by Muslims to be a prophet sent by God before Muhammad
Muhammad	Believed by Muslims to be the last and final Prophet sent by God

Quote from The Qur'an:

Surah 2: 136

We believe in Allah and what he revealed to Abraham, Ishmael and Isaac and Jacob, and what was given to Moses and Jesus and all the prophets by their Lord. We make no distinction between any of them.
