

## Key knowledge for this unit

\*\*The Emigration from Makkah to Madinah is called the 'Hijrah'

f C 12 Years after Muhammad's first revelation, the wealthy merchants of Makkah continued to persecute Muslims.

 $oldsymbol{C}$  Leaders from the city of Madinah invited Muhammad and his followers to leave Makkah and to live instead in Madinah.

C Leaders from Madinah believed Muhammad would be able to stop the violence that grequently broke out between clans in Madinah.

← Muhammad accepted the invitation and in secret, groups of Muslims, left Makkah and travelled to Madinah. With his friend Abu Bakr, Muhammad travelled to Madinah and arrived safely.

 $oldsymbol{C}$  Muhammad had received a revelation from God that gave Muslims the permission to fight (The Qur'an Surah 2:216).

 $oldsymbol{C}$  The Muslims that went to live in Madinah left behind their homes, possessions, and their livelihoods and in Madinah, found it difficult to support themselves.

← The Qur'an permits Muslims to fight if they have been wronged (The Qur'an Surah 22:39)

The Ouran permits Muslims to decend themselves in their have been attacked (The Ouran Surah 2·190)
