

Key knowledge for this unit

C Muslims believe that the first prophet was Adam, who was the first human God created.

← Muslims believe the Qur'an names 25 prophets beginning with Adam and ending with Muhammad.

C In addition to Adam and Muhammad, other prophets that have been named in the Qur'an include Abraham, Moses and Jesus.

C Muhammad is known as the "Seal of the Prophets" which means Muhammad is the last prophet and God will never send another Prophet (Qur'an 33:48)

f C Muslims believe all the prophets taught Islam and the same core message including:

- 1) There is only one God
- 2) Live life in accordance with God's law and guidance
- 3) There will be a Day of Judgement
- 4) There is life after death.


G "Hadith" is a record of Muhammad's words and actions, which after the Qur'an, provides the next most trusted source of information for understanding God's quidance for being a good Muslim.
