

## Key knowledge for this unit

C Muslims believe the Qur'an contains words which literally come from God.

← Muhammad played no part in writing the Qur'an

C Muslims believe the Qur'an was made known by revelation, called Wahy, and that God revealed all of the Qur'an, word-for-word, to Muhammad via the angel Gabriel, known as Jibril.

Muslims believe the Qur'an was revealed in a series of revelations that
 started in 610CE when Muhammed was about 40 years old and ended
 shortly before his death in 632 CE when he was 62 years old.

 $oldsymbol{C}^{oldsymbol{\star}}$  Muslims believe that the Qur'an has no errors or mistakes and is 'infallible'.

Muslims believe the Qur'an was revealed to Muhammad in the same
 way that Abraham, Moses and Jesus had a holy book revealed to them.

← Muslims believe that the Qur'an comes from God and is not influenced by human culture or human thought.

C Muslims also believe that Muhammad was not the author of the Qur'an.
