Encourage your child to consider how an ill-judged messa might damage their reputation or upset a friend who sent something to them in confidence. Encourage your child to treat unexpected messages with caution: get them to consider, for example, whether the message sounds like something a friend or relative would really send them. Make sure the know never to share personal details over WhatsApp, and to be wary of clicking on any links in messages. Setting up two-step verification adds a lurther layer of protection to their WhatsApp account. ADJUST THE SETTINGS CHAT ABOUT PRIVACY vise to change your child's WhatsApp settings (go to 'Privacy', 'Groups') to specify which of their contacts can add them to up chats without needing approval: you can give permission to Contacts' or 'My Contacts Except ...' Some parents like to check in with their child about how they're using WhatsApp, explaining that it will help to keep them safe.
